



Spoon River Trail System

Started in the fall of 2013 to assist the Boy Scouts by providing local routes to canoe, hike and backpack, this trail system enables the Boy Scouts to obtain Merit Badges.

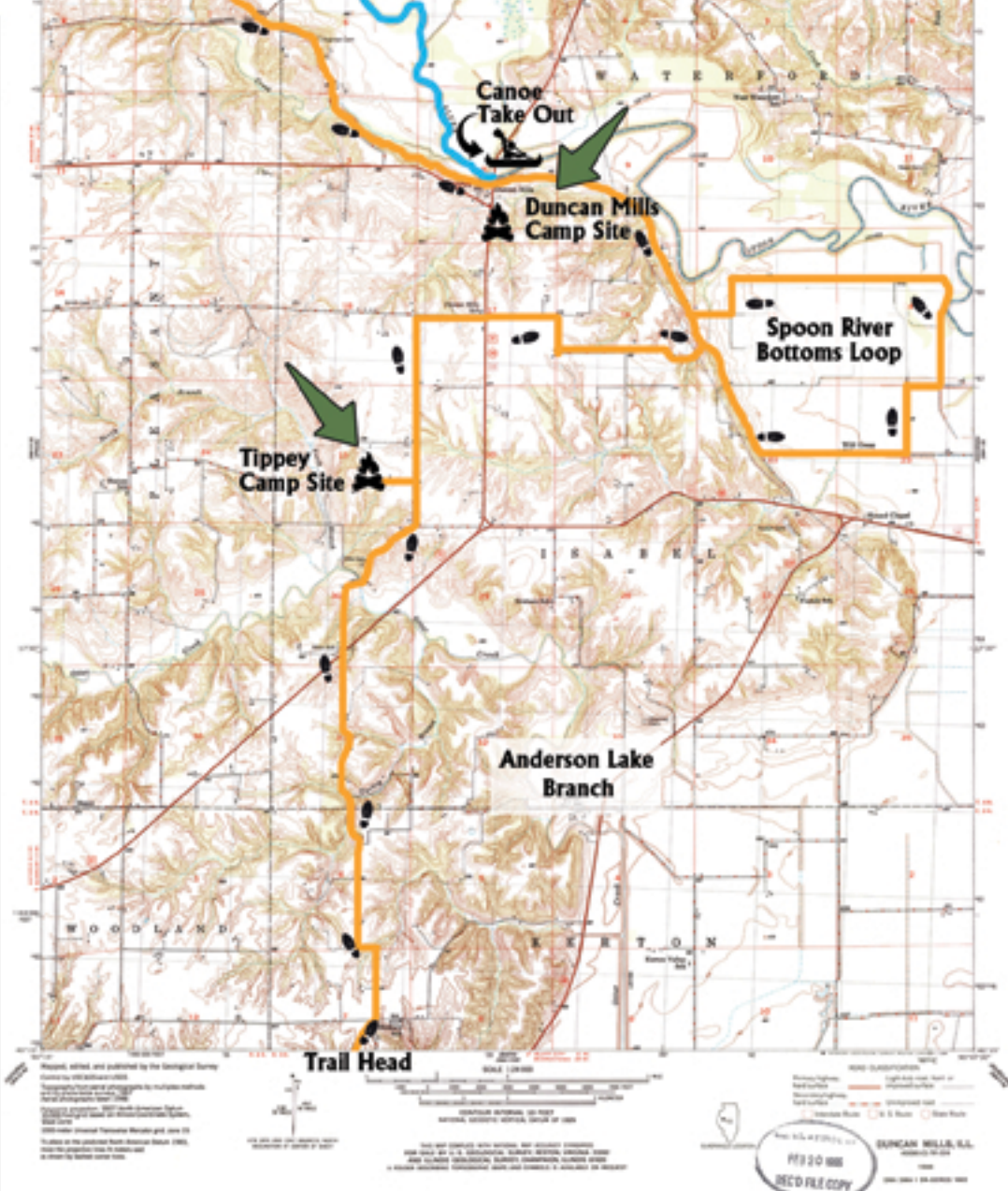
The trail system has been utilized annually since the spring of 2014, and is open to all W.D. Boyce Council Boy Scouts.

The Spoon River Trail System is provided in cooperation with local land owners, who have been gracious enough to offer, without cost or compensation, access to their properties.

We are continuing to expand the trails and campsites to open up more access to a diverse eco system, allowing the Boy Scouts more experiences. By enabling the Boy Scouts to experience more diversity in the eco system, they are able to earn more Merit Badges, such as: Environmental Science; Bird Study; Forestry; Insect Study; Fish & Wildlife Management, and many others. These Merit Badges will help the Scouts along the way to becoming more knowledgeable about the world around them, as well as further them toward their ultimate goal of becoming Eagle Scouts.

The Spoon River Trail System was mapped out and tested by Lewistown BSA Troop 132. Nearly 150 miles of hiking, canoeing and backpacking have occurred on the trails, to date.
